The Guest of Honour was triple World Touring Car Champion Andy Priaulx (8109) and Floreat Collegium was proposed by Mike Read (6823). The food was prepared by College chef John Fleming and was of the highest order. The wine, personally selected by the committee after a series of gruelling tastings, was pretty good too. In October we returned once more to the RAF Club in Piccadilly for the London dinner at which Dr Peter Tooley (4740) was Guest of Honour and Neil Garrett (8015) proposed Floreat Collegium. Once again the OEA was fortunate indeed to be able to call upon such distinguished OEs to attend and speak at our dinners.

This year the OEA committee approved awards from the FG Manchester Fund to Messrs Galpin and Birch who received funds to assist them in attending the Headstart Broad-Based Engineering Course at Loughborough and travelling to the Himalayas respectively. College itself received a contribution towards new fencing pistes. In the future, individual awards to Elizabethans will be made from the association's own funds and will be known as OEA Awards, the FG Manchester Fund will be used to assist with bursaries.

Application forms for this year's Guernsey and London Dinners are enclosed. This year, by popular demand, the Guernsey dinner will return to the College Hall but we will still be able to make use of chef John Fleming and the excellent cooking facilities in the refectory. Guest of Honour will be Dan Guillemette (7818), son of former OEA President Nick Guillemette (5224) and Lead Physiotherapist for the Team Sky cycling team. You will all now hopefully be aware of the very special dinner being held in London on 15th October to celebrate the OEA's 125th anniversary. Guest of Honour will be Roger Perrot (5450) and the venue is Drapers' Hall and, as a one off, OEs will be able to bring their partners to the dinner. Places at the Guernsey and London dinners can be booked either by completing and submitting the enclosed forms or online at oea.org.gg/guernsey-dinner or oea.org.gg/london-dinner respectively. Bookings will be taken on a first come first serve basis and places for both dinners will be limited so please do book early to avoid disappointment. Half of the 200 places available at the London Dinner have already been reserved.

Steve Sharman (7555) continues to drive OE sport forward with vigour and enthusiasm. The 1st and 2nd XI Hockey matches were held in March with a great turn out of OEs and two closely contested matches against College both ending in a draw. As usual I attach a leaflet with more details about the golf.

This year's AGM will take place at 6.00pm on Friday 17 June 2016 in the FG Manchester Refectory at College. As usual, the agenda is short and refreshments will be provided.

Finally, I hope to see as many of you as possible at OE events this year, especially the London dinner which promises to be a memorable event.

**MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING
OF THE OLD ELIZABETHAN ASSOCIATION
HELD IN THE FG MANCHESTER REFECTORY AT ELIZABETH COLLEGE
AT 1800 HOURS ON FRIDAY 19 JUNE 2015**

Present:

Chairman: J T Bell - President
J R W Ovenden - Secretary

There were 14 members present and the meeting was declared quorate and started at 1810 hours.

Item 1 – Apologies

Apologies were received from John Hardie, Bruce Spittal, Mark Bousfield, Toby Le Lacheur, Nick Paluch, Mike Eades, Callum Beaton, Keith Bichard and Godfray Guilbert.

Item 2 - Minutes of the 2014 Annual General Meeting

The Secretary had circulated the minutes from the 2014 AGM with the annual mail shot and also by e-mail and they were available to read online. Copies of the minutes were also available to read at the AGM. The Secretary asked for a member to propose that the minutes were a true record of the 2014 AGM.

Proposed by Rupert Pleasant and seconded by Simon Ross. Following a vote, the minutes were accepted as a true record.

Item 3 - Report of the Honorary Secretary

The Report had been circulated to the Membership with the annual mail shot and also by e-mail and it was available to read online. Copies of the report were also available to read at the AGM. Given its wide circulation the Honorary Secretary did not read out his report and there was no further comment.

Item 4 - Report of the Honorary Treasurer

The OEA accounts had been circulated to the Membership with the annual mail shot and also by e-mail. Copies of the accounts and the Honorary Treasurer's report were also available to read at the AGM. As the Honorary Treasurer was unable to attend the President instead gave his annual report.

Vice-President John Bridle asked about the Admin Fee detailed in the accounts. The President confirmed that the fee represented a portion of the salary of Sara Wright who carried out a number of duties on behalf of the OEA as part of her role in the Foundation Office. John also asked about the FG Manchester portfolio and the level of funds still in it. The President confirmed that following the payment of £300,000 from the Manchester portfolio towards the cost of the FG Manchester Refectory the balance was some £100,000. The President explained that the decision had been made to distribute this sum to the OEA for longer-term investment for the benefit of Elizabethans. The President further explained that in the future the FG Manchester Awards would be renamed OEA Awards.

Keith Bichard and John Gollop both commented that they did not want to see the name of FG Manchester disappear as a result of the new subscription arrangements and the consequent re-organisation of the Association's finances. The President confirmed that the name FG Manchester would live on because the College refectory had been named after him. Mike Eades had previously confirmed that there would be a photo of FG Manchester in the new refectory as well as an account of his career at College. The President also confirmed that there is an on-going discussion with the College about the possibility of a bursary scheme. It is likely that the Manchester name will be associated with such a scheme.

Item 5 - Election of one or more Vice-Presidents of the Association

The Secretary read out the names of the present incumbents and confirmed that they were all available and willing to stand once more. The Secretary asked for a member to propose the re-election of the present incumbents. Proposed by Adie Peacegood and seconded by Glen Broadhurst. Following a vote, those willing to stand again were duly re-elected.

Item 6 - Election of the Honorary Secretary

At the 2014 AGM James Ovenden was elected Honorary Secretary for a period of one year. He is eligible and willing to stand again. Proposed by the President and seconded by Nick Guillemette. Following a vote, James Ovenden was duly re-elected.

Item 7 - Election of the Honorary Treasurer

At the 2014 AGM Bruce Spittal was elected Honorary Treasurer for a period of one year. He is eligible and willing to stand again. Proposed by Glen Broadhurst and seconded by Rupert Pleasant. Following a vote, Bruce Spittal was duly re-elected.

Item 8 – Election of Committee members

The Secretary read out the names of the present incumbents and confirmed that they were all available and willing to stand once more apart from Simon Ross, John Hardie and Toby Le Lacheur. The Honorary Secretary asked for a member to propose the re-election of the present incumbents except Simon Ross, John Hardie and Toby Le Lacheur. Proposed by Manus Carvill and seconded by John Gollop. Following a vote, those willing to stand again were duly re-elected.

The Honorary Secretary was asked by the President to formally record in the minutes the great appreciation of the OEA of the contributions made by Simon, John and Toby during their time as committee members.

Item 9 – Election of new Committee members

The Secretary confirmed that since the last AGM, in accordance with Rule 7, the committee had co-opted three new members on to the Committee, namely Mat Heaume, Adie Peacegood and Rupert Pleasant. Mat is a current member of the Common Room and has replaced Toby Le Lacheur as the College representative on the committee. Adie Peacegood and Rupert Pleasant have replaced on the committee Simon Ross and John Hardie respectively. All three are willing and eligible to stand. The Secretary asked for a member to propose the ratification of these appointments. Mat Heaume was proposed by Rob Newton and seconded by Simon Ross; Rupert Pleasant was proposed by the President and seconded by Manus Carvill; and Adie Peacegood was proposed by the President and seconded by Glen Broadhurst. Following a vote, the appointments of all three were ratified.

Item 10 - Election of Financial Examiner for 2014/2015

The President confirmed that Glen Broadhurst was willing and eligible to stand as Honorary Financial Examiner for 2014/2015 until proposed changes to the Association's constitution are finalised. It was explained by the President that Glen has a controls and audit based background. The Secretary asked for a member to propose Glen. Proposed by the President and seconded by Simon Ross. Following a vote, Glen was duly elected.

Item 11 - Any other business brought forward in accordance with Rule 6

Written notice had been sent by e-mail by the President to the Honorary Secretary in accordance with Rule 6 in relation to proposed changes to Rules 4, 5 and 6 of the Regulations.

It was proposed that the respective Rules be amended to read as follows:

Rule 4

"4. The Directors, the Principal, all members of the College teaching staff, the Bursar of the College and the staff of the Foundation Office shall be ex-officio Honorary Members of the Association for the duration of their appointment at College"

Rule 5

"5. The Committee shall have the power to elect as Honorary Life members any past members of the Directors or any other persons who in the opinion of the Committee have been of special service to the College, whether they are Old Elizabethans or not. In addition, any member of the College Common Room who completes 20 years' service will be eligible and will be invited to become an Honorary Life Member of the Association"

Rule 6

"6. An Annual General Meeting of the Association, of which 14 days' notice is to be given, shall be held in the months of June or July to discuss the suggestions of the Committee and to consider any other business properly brought forward. At this meeting the Honorary Treasurer shall present a financial report and the Honorary Secretary shall give a report of the year's work. Any suggestions for discussion at such meetings must be communicated in writing to the Honorary Secretary at least seven days before the meeting and shall be added to the agenda.

The agenda, the Honorary Treasurer's Financial Report (or Balance sheet subject to audit) and the Honorary Secretary's Report shall be sent by post or e-mail to all Members at least 14 days before the Annual General Meeting"

The Honorary Secretary asked for a member to propose the changes to the Rules 4, 5 and 6. Proposed by Simon Ross and seconded by Rob Newton. Following a vote, the rule changes were confirmed.

The Meeting closed at 19.51 hours.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015**

- Note 1 Annual Members have been offered an opportunity to convert to Life Members with a 'top-up' payment based on estimated annual payments already paid. This has meant the annual subscriptions have reduced as standing orders have been cancelled.
- Note 2 The Association has purchased a further supply of 500 pairs of cufflinks which are available to purchase by OEA Members for £35 each and these are also presented to all College students who leave College and have opted in to the new OEA Life Membership scheme
- Note 3 Kindly note that due to an administrative error the cost of the Guernsey Dinner Food was not submitted to the OEA for payment until after the year end. An amount of £3,290 has been paid to EC and therefore the actual overall cost of the dinners is a deficit of £308.91
- Note 4 As part of the arrangement to hold the Guernsey dinner in the FG Manchester Refectory the OEA arranged to purchase a supply of red and white wine. The wine was made available to members to purchase during the meal. The remaining stock will be sold to EC for supply at the 2016 Guernsey Dinner and thereafter as they see fit.
- Note 5 As advised at the last AGM the Trustees of the FG Manchester Fund have decided to distribute the trust assets, following the donation to the College Foundation for the refectory, to the OEA in order for the Association to combine the Associations funds of £100,000 and the remaining trust assets amounting to £105,890.84 to create a long term investment portfolio under the management of Ravenscroft.
- Note 6 Following the transfer of the FG Manchester Fund to the OEA, the first FG Manchester Bursary award has been started.






